Airport TIKI at Fort Pierce

Tired of the same old local food stops? Looking for something a little bit farther out? Consider the Airport Tiki Restaurant over at Fort Pierce (KFPR). It's about an hour flight at a leisurely pace across the state. Easy to fly to VFR or IFR. Once on the ground, tell the tower you want to "Taxi To The Tiki" and they will point you in the

right direction. Ramp personnel will guide you into a nice spot on the ramp, right in front of the restaurant windows, and chock your wheels. You don't have to buy fuel, and there's no landing fee! Need to re-file your flight plan or check the weather? There's a full service flight planning station right off the restaurant lobby. The airport itself is quite nice, if you need some IFR currency work, make this one of your stops, there are mul-

tiple instrument approaches and multiple runways into KFPR.

Now for the important part: The Food! The aviation themed menu will get your mouth watering for any of their breakfast or lunch dishes, and they are all excellent! The service is friendly, the portions are generous, and the prices won't bruise the wallet.

The tiki-themed restaurant is bright and fun, and has a great view of the airfield activity. It's a nice place to sit and finish your coffee and watch the traffic on the runways or catch who's taxiing in and out. You never know what kind of aircraft will be visiting, it's always an interesting mix.
