# PROCEDURES TO BE FOLLOWED FOR LEANING CUB CLUB AIRCRAFT

When taxiing lean the engine way back, without having an RPM drop. If there is a problem with a mag check follow the below procedure TO THE LETTER:

BRING THE RPM UP TO 2000.

LEAN ALL THE WAY BACK UNTIL YOU SEE A RPM DROP AND THEN MOVE THE MIXTURE TO EVEN OUT THE RPM AT 2000.

ONCE THIS IS DONE- KEEP THE MIXTURE LEAN FOR 1 FULL MINUTE . USE A TIMER IF NECESSARY

REDUCE RPM TO IDLE AND THEN PROCEED WITH ANOTHER MAG CHECK. IF EVERYTHING IS SMOOTH, YOU ARE DONE.

IF THERE IS STILL A PROBLEM WITH A MAG- REPEAT THE ABOVE PROCEDURE ONE MORE TIME. IF THIS DOESN'T CLEAR IT –

# Announcements...

NEW TERMINOLOGY IN USE:

"LINE UP & WAIT"

What does it mean?

Remember "Position & Hold?" Well, this is the new term for the same thing. If you are issued this clearance instruction, it means you should pull your aircraft out onto the active runway and line up on the centerline, then wait for your take-off clearance. It is intended to save time and expedite departures at busy airports, and it is currently being used at airports all across the Country.

Just be sure to keep your eyes and ears open, and be on high alert... don't forget you are sitting still at the approach of an active runway!

#### LATE FEES

Effective October 1, 2010: Due to an increase in delinquent accounts, accounts not paid in full will be assessed a late fee of 1-1/2% or a minimum of \$5.00 per month, whichever is greater.

#### INACTIVE DUES

Effective October 1, 2010, the dues for "InActive" members was increased from \$10 to \$20 per month. This change was necessitated by the increasing number of "InActive" members and the ongoing and continuing fixed costs of maintaining aircraft which are logging flight times far below objectives.

# Board Meeting Minutes - Synopsis, October, 2010 by Ellen Herr

The officers and board of directors met on October 20, 2010 at 6:30 PM in conference room at the Page Field Aviation Center. Below is a synopsis of the business discussed at that meeting:

Kirchner reported that total flight time last month was 57.7 hours was an all time low for any month in the club history. The club presently has 134 members, including 42 inactive members. All accounts that are 90 days delinquent were reviewed and the board voted to dispose of several bills that were not collectible. Graham presented a report on his analysis of the financial status of the club, stating that recruiting and retaining active members should be a priority. The club will have all three aircraft displayed at Page Field Day, and is requesting volunteers to staff the booth and talk to potential members. A flight bag, headsets and pilot accessories donated by the family of John Wojicki will be raffled at our booth. The ½ off initiation dues special will apply for any new members joining in November. No member rewards will be given for current club members who recruit a new members at this reduced initiation rate. Meyersburg reports the modified sunburst logo option was selected by a membership vote as the club's new logo for communications including the website, stationery, etc. The design will be adapted by a volunteer graphic artist to clarify the image. The name change discussion has been put on hold at this time. Unsold tickets for the Halloran event have been given to the board members to sell. Any club member needing a ticket can purchase them from a board member. Orv Curry, Skip Bentley and Sherrie Lorenz are running for the open board position. Anyone interested in running for the 5 open board positions is encouraged to apply.

The board approved a change in the minimum number of hours per day that each pilot needs to fly when taking an aircraft on an extended trip request (more than 72 hours). Hours required per day was decreased from 2.5 to 1.5 hours, with the user being billed for 1/3 of the remaining hours not flown.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:10

The next board meeting will be held on November 17, 2010 at 6:30PM. Any club member having concerns or questions about club operations should contact any board member.

THIS MONTH'S QUESTION AND ANSWER:

Member: "Hey, Cubby, I want to fly a Club airplane out of the country for a vacation. What are the Club rules?"

CUBBY: "Good question! Flights to the Bahamas are approved. Any other flights outside of the United States require prior approval by the Board of Directors. All pilots operating outside of the US must have 150 hours PIC or an IFR rating. And all pilots must be knowledgeable and conform to any rules and regulations governing flight into and out of the respective destination country. Thanks for asking!"
